MORE MEN NEEDED FOR VOLUNTEER DUTIES JULY 1917

The appeal for more recruits for the local Company of Volunteers has not met the response expected, even following the call in April.

The necessary withdrawal of men for active service, has left the Volunteer ranks short of men. These vacancies can be met by men who have passed the present limit for Military service or were not fit for service.

In the past the company of Volunteers was looked upon as a group of well meaning amateurs who had no official status or recognition. The Volunteers are now fully part of His Majesty's Forces and are being equipped by the Government.

The Volunteers are needed to fully protect the Homeland and undertake tasks that are vital to the war effort.
